In Charles Wesley's journal entry of May 23, 1738, he wrote, "At nine I began a hymn on my conversion but was persuaded to break off for fear of pride...I prayed Christ to stand by me and finish the hymn."

Five questions are asked at the beginning of the hymn, which establish a feeling of urgency that moves unrelentingly throughout this piece. The text exclaims the mystery of God's grace extended to sinners who turn to Christ in faith. These sinners receive the righteousness of Christ and can approach the Lord's throne in confidence. He sang the hymn with his brother John shortly after John's "Aldersgate experience."

Like so many of Charles Wesley's hymn texts, "And Can It Be" is full of allusions to and quotations from Scripture. One of them, Acts 12:6-8, refers to Peter's experience in prison when an angel appeared to him and told him to get up. Peter's chains fell off and he followed the angel out of prison. Wesley also used several metaphors in this hymn, contrasting light and darkness, life and death, slavery and freedom, and especially Christ's righteousness and our unrighteousness.


