The Burning Bush

Moses was taking care of the flock for his father-in-law Jethro, Midian's priest. He led his flock out to the edge of the desert, and he came to God's mountain called Horeb. The LORD's messenger appeared to him in a flame of fire in the middle of a bush. Moses saw that the bush was in flames, but it didn't burn up. Then Moses said to himself, Let me check out this amazing sight and find out why the bush isn't burning up.

Exodus 3:1-3 CEB

Mike Slaughter, lead pastor at Ginghamburg Church, located in Tipp City, Ohio, authored a book titled "Dare to Dream". Mike had three main purposes for writing the book. First, to help readers discover the God-dream inside of them. Second, to help readers develop a life mission statement. Third, to challenge the readers to commit to their God-directed life mission. Mike writes, "Remember, you are going to die. Today is the day to seize the present of the presence."

This brings me to the third chapter titled, "**The Burning Bush.**" According to Mike we all go through stages during our life, "life stages." Mike divides them into three major stages. Stage 1: Empire Building; this is the stage where we are consumed with "getting" what we want and need. This stage is about climbing the ladder of life. Stage 2: Disillusionment; this is usually brought on by some crisis. We all have experienced some form of crisis, trouble, loss-ness, or sickness. Stage 3: A Fire That Won't Burn Out, your **Burning Bush**. A burning bush moment is when you have a close encounter with God and you "hear" what God's purpose is for you. The Burning Bush moment is the answer to your question, "what is my purpose?"

Moses had these stage transitions every forty years; forty years as an Egyptian Prince, forty years in Midian as a shepherd, and forty years in the Wilderness as a spokesperson for God. Moses' burning bush experience came while he was doing his "Routine Thing." Just think, while we are doing our thing, God interjects God's consuming presence. And if we will stop and dare to check it, **The Burning Bush**, out, our lives will never be the same old "Routine Thing." Moses' burning bush encounter initiated a relationship with God, inspired a faith in God, and influenced the people around Moses.

Yes, "A Fire That Won't Burn Out." Mike dissolves the three stages down to their lowest common denominator. Stage 1 is "Bless Me." Stage 2 is "Save Me." Stage 3 is "Use Me." Mike goes on to close the chapter with these words, "A dream without action is meaningless." When your burning bush happens, stop and check it out (Be Present). Don't worry - we have many burning bush moments (GRACE) until God gets our attention.

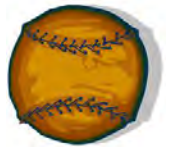

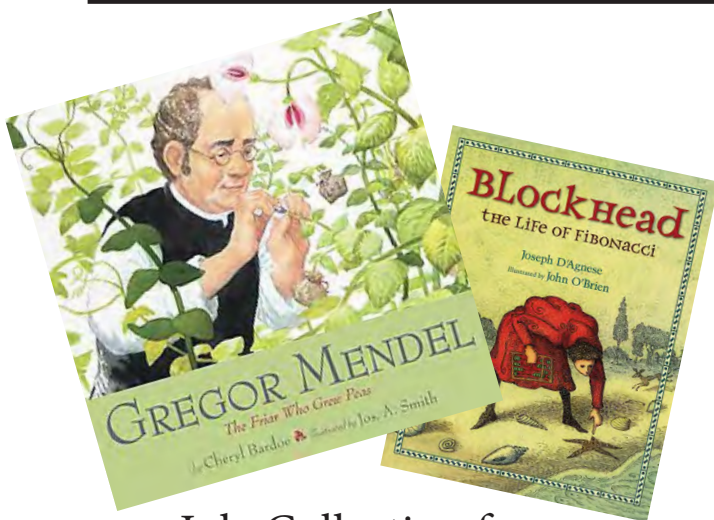

Health & Wellness Updates *From our Parish Nurse...*

This month I'm writing about sleep apnea. This abnormality can effect people of all ages, even children. Sleep apnea can be a potentially serious sleep disorder in which breathing repeatedly stops and starts. There are different types of sleep disorders.

Obstructive sleep apnea is the most common. This occurs when throat muscles in the back of the throat relax, this narrows the upper airway while sleeping. The narrowing causes a lack of air to enter the lungs which results in less oxygen to your body and vital organs. The body tries to compensate with a greater effort to breathe air through the narrow airway. You can have loud snoring, snorting, choking, or a gasping sound. As your brain senses this inability to breathe, you will briefly rouse from sleep so that you can reopen your airway. These brief awakenings can be so brief throughout the night that you don't remember them. These disruptions impair your ability to reach the desired deep sleep you need.

Central sleep apnea is a less common form of sleep that happens when your brain fails to transmit signals to your breathing muscles. You make no effort to breathe for short periods of time. You may awaken with shortness of breath or have difficulty getting to sleep or staying asleep.

Complex sleep apnea syndrome, also known as treatment-emergent central sleep apnea, is a third form of sleep apnea. This occurs when someone has both obstructive and central sleep apnea.

The most common signs and symptoms of obstructive and central sleep apnea include: loud snoring, episodes of breathing cessation during sleep witnessed by another person, abrupt awakenings accompanied by shortness of breath, which is more indicative of central sleep apnea, awakening with a dry mouth or sore throat, morning headaches, difficulty staying asleep (insomnia), excessive daytime sleepiness, attention problems, and irritability.

Some major risk factors of sleep apnea are: Excess weight, the size of your neck circumference, a narrowed airway, being male (men are twice as likely to have sleep apnea), being older, family history, use of alcohol, sedatives, or tranquilizers, smoking (smokers are three times more likely to have obstructive sleep apnea), and nasal congestion.

Sleep apnea can cause other medical problems. Sudden drops in blood oxygen levels that occur during sleep apnea increases blood pressure and affects the cardiovascular system. It also affects other metabolic conditions. It is very important to seek a medical diagnosis and to have a treatment plan you follow.

Your doctor may order a nocturnal polysomnography. In a sleep lab you will be hooked up to equipment that monitors your heart, lungs, brain activity, breathing pattern, arm and leg movement, and blood oxygen levels while you sleep. There are also tests that you may take from home.

For milder cases of sleep apnea,

your doctor may recommend only lifestyle changes. Lifestyle and self-care tips: Lose excess weight, exercise, avoid alcohol and certain medications, such as tranquilizers and sleeping pills, sleep on your side rather than your back, treat your nasal allergies, and keep your nasal passages open at night, use of a saline nasal spray, and stop smoking.

If you are diagnosed with sleep apnea, you may need a continuous positive airway pressure machine, (CPAP). With CPAP the air pressure is somewhat greater than that of the surrounding air, this is just enough to keep your upper airway passages open. If CPAP is a problem for you, there are other devices that may be used. There are even oral appliances to keep your throat open. You may also be referred to a ear, nose, and throat doctor to rule out any blockage in your nose or throat.

It is imperative to have good communication with your doctor and to find the right solution that will work for you. Remember there are different options. Being able to sleep well and to wake up feeling refreshed is very important to your overall health.
