Know therefore that the LORD your God is God; he is the faithful God, keeping his **covenant** of love to a thousand generations of those who love him and keep his commandments. *Deuteronomy 7:9 NIV*

*In 1663 Richard Alleine, a Puritan, published *Vindiciae Pietatis: or, "A Vindication of Godliness in the Greater Strictness and Spirituality of It."* Wesley used one chapter, "The Application of the Whole," on Monday, August 11, 1755, in what probably was the first real celebration of the **Covenant Service** in the Methodist movement. Wesley found the service rich and meaningful, as expressed in his *Journal*: "Many mourned before God, and many were comforted" (April 1756); "It was, as usual, a time of remarkable blessing" (October 1765). "It was an occasion for a variety of spiritual experiences ... I do not know that ever we had a greater blessing. Afterwards many desired to return thanks, either for a sense of pardon, for full salvation, or for a fresh manifestation of His graces, healing all their backslidings" (January 1, 1775). In London these services were usually held on New Year's Day. Around the country the **Covenant Service** was conducted whenever John Wesley visited the Methodist Societies. The heart of the service, focused in the **Covenant Prayer**, requires persons to commit themselves to God. This covenant is serious and assumes adequate preparation for and continual response to the **covenant**.¹*

Believe this: When God calls us to a task, God gives us help to *finish* it. One sign of God is that we are led to work that we did not intend to do. Another sign of God is that we are trusted to seek God's help to take the task to completion.²

As we stand here at the beginning of a new year, it's a good time to think about the faith-projects before us. In the coming year, how can you build accountability into your life to encourage faithful discipleship? I invite you to join us in our **Covenant Renewal Service**, January 7, 2018, at our 10 a.m. service as we **covenant with God!** What better way to begin your New Year?

A Covenant Prayer in the Wesleyan Tradition (Contemporary Version)

I am no longer my own, but yours.
 Put me to what you will, place me with whom you will.
 Put me to doing, put me to suffering.
 Let me be put to work for you or set aside for you,
 Praised for you or criticized for you.
 Let me be full, let me be empty.
 Let me have all things, let me have nothing.
 I freely and fully surrender all things to your glory and service.
 And now, O wonderful and holy God, Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer,
 you are mine, and I am yours. So be it.
 And the covenant which I have made on earth,
 Let it also be made in heaven. **Amen.**

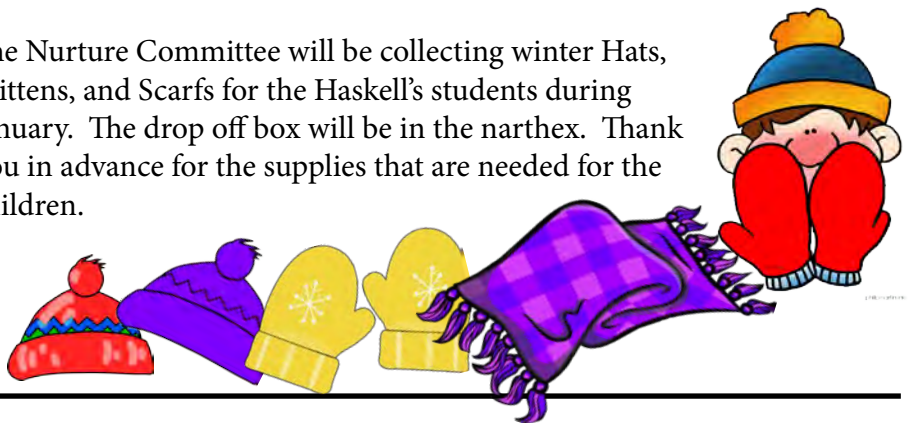

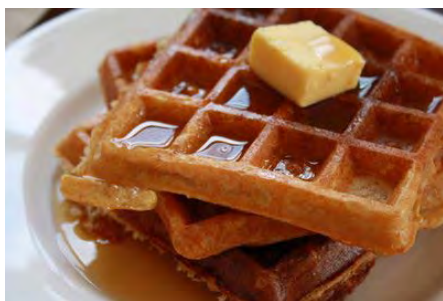

Just Mercy

by Bryan Stevenson

at Lorna’s

Bryan Stevenson grew up poor in Delaware. His great-grandparents had been slaves in Virginia. His grandfather was murdered in a Philadelphia housing project when Stevenson was a teenager. Stevenson attended Eastern College (now Eastern University), a Christian institution outside Philadelphia, and then Harvard Law School. Afterward he began representing poor clients in the South, first in Georgia and then in Alabama, where he was a co-founder of the Equal Justice Initiative.

“Just Mercy” focuses mainly on that work, and those clients. Its

narrative backbone is the story of Walter McMillian, whom Stevenson began representing in the late 1980s when he was on death row for killing a young white woman in Monroeville, Ala., the hometown of Harper Lee. Monroeville has long promoted its connection to “To Kill a Mockingbird,” which is about a black man falsely accused of the rape of a white woman. As Stevenson writes, “Sentimentality about Lee’s story grew even as the harder truths of the book took no root.” Walter McMillian had never heard of the book, and had scarcely been in trouble with the law. He had, however, been having an affair with a white woman, and Stevenson makes a persuasive case that it made McMillian, who cut timber for a living, vulnerable to prosecution.

Health & Wellness *From our Parish Nurse...*

I hope you have heard that the flu shot this season is predicted to have decreased effectiveness. Last year, the CDC estimated that the vaccine was 42% effective and this season, the CDC is predicting approximately 10% effectiveness. By this past November it was estimated that only 39% of the general population was vaccinated. This is not good news.

Everyone's risk of developing the flu is different. The highest-risk population is the elderly, pregnant women, infants, and people who have underlying conditions such as lung or heart disease. What can we do now to help ourselves and others?

Most flu cases usually appear in February and often persist well into March. You still can get your flu shot if you haven't. A small percentage of coverage is better than no coverage, and if you do come down with the flu, symptoms may be less severe.

Flu viruses survive best when humidity is lowest, which is in the winter months. Make sure your home has adequate humidity. Buying a nasal saline spray and using it twice a day will help in keeping nasal passages moist, which can be beneficial. There is no evidence that antibacterial soaps work any better than washing with regular soap and water in preventing the spread of germs.

Unfortunately, most people are contagious for a day or so before their symptoms become apparent. This is why it is very very important to always practice scrupulous hy-

giene during this whole season, not just when you think you should. When you wash your hands with soap and water, sing to yourself the ABC's before rinsing.

FLU SYMPTOMS: Onset is sudden, within a day, and sometimes within hours. Severity is more severe than a cold. Chills, dry cough, fever, headache, severe muscle aches, stuffy nose, sore throat, extreme fatigue, and weakness are common. The flu often starts with a temperature over 100 F.

Call your doctor about antiviral medications such as Tamiflu or Relenza, especially if you're 65 or older, younger than 5, pregnant or just had a baby, or have asthma, heart disease, or other chronic diseases. Antivirals can shorten the flu by about a day and reduce the risk of pneumonia and other complications, but only if started within 48 hours of the onset of symptoms.

Monitor your temperature. Sudden spikes can trigger seizures, especially in young children. Watch for complications; the flu can get serious quickly. Call your doctor if you have difficulty breathing or swallowing or if you experience disorientation. These symptoms can indicate pneumonia, bronchitis, sinusitis, dehydration, or another health problem. Notify your doctor if your throat is so sore that drinking is painful or if you have difficulty urinating.

COLD SYMPTOMS: Onset is gradual, over a day or two. A cold will usually start with a sore scratchy throat, then a runny or stuffed nose, sneezing, and finally

a cough. There is no prescription medication proven to shorten the common cold. Antibiotics work against bacterial infections, not viral ones such as colds.

The severity of colds should remain mild to moderate and a fever may be low to none. Consider calling your doctor if symptoms worsen or don't improve. You may be developing a bacterial infection on top of a viral one which would require an antibiotic.

Some good non-drug options are: Lozenges, honey, gargling with salt water, and fluids. Consider alternating water with teas, juices, electrolyte drinks, and soups. Remember to listen to your body, rest, and pamper yourself. If you're in doubt, don't hesitate to call your doctor for advice. Please let me know if I can be of assistance in your health and wellness.
