Drinking Our Cup

"You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said to them. "Can you **drink the cup** I am going to drink?" *Matthew 20:22 NIV*

Salome, the mother of James and John, came and kneeled before Jesus, and asked a favor. Jesus responded, "What is it you want?" She said, "Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom." Jesus responded, "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said to them. "Can you **drink the cup** I am going to drink?" "We can," they answered. Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink from my cup..."

Jesus retreated to a private place to pray, the garden of Gethsemane, and took His disciples. Jesus left eight disciples at the entrance of the garden, and took Peter, James, and John with him a little farther into the garden. Then he said to them, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me." Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."¹ He was about to "**drink the cup**" that God (Father) had prepared for Him, and this meant bearing on His body the sins of the world. The mystery of His humanity and deity is seen vividly in this scene.

The cup was sometimes used in the Gospels to designate the sum of one's life for the cause of God's redeeming work in the world. Drinking the cup of life, makes our own cup, everything we are living. It is saying, "This is my life," but also, "I want this to be my life."² Drinking the cup of life is fully appropriate and internalizing our own unique existence, with all of its ins and outs, ups and downs, sorrows and joys. All this is done in the power of the Holy Spirit, for Jesus' sake and God's will.

Because we participate in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, we too are empowered to embrace all that life brings. As we travel beyond the Tomb with our Cross, in the power of the Holy Spirit, we will **drink our cup!**

Health & Wellness *From our Parish Nurse...*

You probably realize that stress can take a toll on the quality of your sleep, but you may not know exactly how or why. Basically, it's because feeling stressed interferes with your body's (and mind's) ability to relax and fall into a deep sleep.

So if you can't relax after a difficult day once you've slipped under the covers, good quality sleep is bound to be elusive. You're likely to have trouble falling asleep, staying asleep, or sleeping soundly. The time you spend in deep, restorative sleep may be reduced, as well. Adding insult to frustration, if you sleep poorly at night, there's a good chance that you'll be more reactive to stress the next day.

So how can you tell whether you're too stressed to sleep soundly? Your body and mind are likely to give you some clues. Here are three.

YOU CAN'T TURN OFF YOUR BUSY MIND.

Instead, you keep going over and over your stresses, worries, and frustrations, contemplating them

from various angles. It's almost like they're playing on a continuous loop that you can't shut off, making sleep elusive.

YOUR MUSCLES ARE SERIOUSLY TENSE.

If you're experiencing muscle tension and pain, or stress-related aches such as neck and shoulder pain or headaches, it can be difficult for you to fall asleep or stay asleep. Complicating matters, poor sleep can set the stage for you to experience even more tension headaches and increased pain sensitivity the next day.

YOUR HEART IS RACING.

A revved up or variable heart rate is a common stress symptom, and it's associated with increased levels of cortisol (a stress hormone), greater physical tension, and increased autonomic arousal effects that are not conducive to falling asleep or sleeping well. On the contrary, it's a set-up for sleep disturbances.

Fortunately, if you spend some time doing relaxation exercises, such as progressive muscle relaxation or deep breathing before turning in for the night, you can help your body and mind dial down the stress. It's also wise to develop a **relaxing pre-sleep ritual**: which might include, turning off the TV & electronics, dimming the lights, turning down the volume of your music, taking a warm bath, having a soothing cup of caffeine-free tea, using aroma therapy, read a book, using medications appropriately, cozying up with a warm blanket, **praying**, etc. that you use consistently to promote a good night's sleep, night after night.

I hope these suggestions will be helpful and you will feel refreshed once again after a good night's sleep. If you have questions or concerns, give me a call.....

Now it's on to our next program year, 2018-2019. There are many things I would like to do to enhance the music program of Court Street UMC. The Music Department has no budgeted funds in Court Street's operating budget. We depend on designated donations.

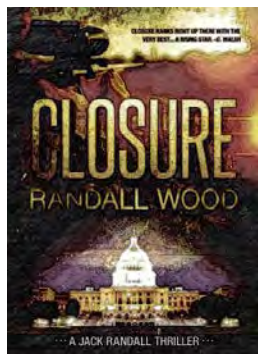
Spring Fling 2018

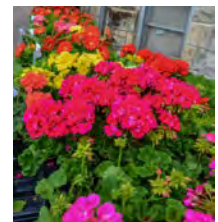
