

Leader: The Spirit of the Lord is with us.

Leader: Spirit of fire, Spirit over the waters, Spirit of holiness!

People: Glory to you!

Leader: Eternal God, One in Three and Three in One! **People:** All glory is yours, now and forever. Amen!
